WHEN THE HOLY SPIRIT COMES

JI Packer reminds us that "On Pentecost Sunday, year after year, our minds go back to that wonderful narrative in the second chapter of the book of Acts where we read of how the Spirit came to begin his new covenant ministry and so to bring to birth in its fullness the Christian Church."

The Church is created by the Holy Spirit. It owes its being from its inception to its very end to the Holy Spirit. We have to remember that in the Godhead, the Holy Spirit is always spoken of as the Third Person, only as far as the order is concerned, and not as the time is involved. All the three persons of the trinity are theologically speaking co-eternal. It is to be understood that the Holy Spirit, being the Third distinct Person of the Trinity, is not involved in any independent activity or mission to the exclusion of the other two Persons of the Trinity.

Samuel Chadwick in The Way to Pentecost elaborates on the work of the Holy Spirit; "The work of the Holy Spirit in the Church is set forth in the promises of Jesus, on the eve of His departure, and demonstrated in the Acts of the Apostles. The Gospels tell of all that Jesus began to do and to teach, until the day in which He was received up, and the Acts of the Apostles tell of all that He continued to do and to teach, AFTER the day in which He was received up. His mission (The Holy Spirit) is to glorify Christ by perpetuating His character, establishing His Kingdom and accomplishing His redeeming purpose in the world. The Church is the Body of Christ and the Spirit is the Spirit of Christ. He fills the Body, directs its movements, controls its members, inspires its wisdom, and supplies its strength.

He guides into the truth, sanctifies its agents and empowers for witness. The work of the Church is to 'minister the spirit,' to speak His message and transmit His power. He calls and distributes controls and guides, inspires and strengthens."

Section 14 of the Lausanne Covenant (1974) (most evangelical denominations are signatories) states: We believe in the power of the Holy Spirit. The Father sent His Spirit to bear witness to His Son; without his witness ours is futile. Conviction of sin, faith in Christ, new birth, and Christian growth are all His work. Further, the Holy Spirit is a missionary Spirit; thus evangelism should arise spontaneously from a Spirit-filled church. A church that is not a missionary church is contradicting itself and quenching the Spirit. Worldwide evangelism will become a realistic possibility only when the Spirit renews the church in truth and wisdom, faith, holiness, love and power. We therefore call upon all Christians to pray for such a visitation of the Spirit of God that all of His fruit may appear in all of His people, and that all of His gifts may enrich

the Body of Christ. Only then will the whole church become a fit instrument in His hands, that the whole earth may hear His voice."

Jesus in His final moments with His disciples before the crucifixion gives them more information about the work of the Holy Spirit will do; "But the Counsellor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:26-27)


In John 16:7-15 "But very truly I tell you, it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. When he comes, he will prove the world to be in the wrong about sin and right-eousness and judgment: about sin, because people do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; and about judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned.

"I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you. All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you."
